

**Minutes of the General Council Meeting of  
Archery Association of India  
held on 5<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 (Sunday) at 11.00 AM  
at The Leela Conventional Ambience Hall, Viswash Nagar, Delhi**

At the outset, Shri Pramod Chandurkar, Hony. Secretary General of Archery Association of India informed the House that Hon'ble President, Shri Arjun Munda ji could not attend today's General Council meeting due to an important meeting scheduled at Ranchi. President has authorized Capt. Abhimanyu Sandhu ji, Senior Vice-President to preside over the meeting by the President.

The Secretary General welcomed Shri Tanveer Singh Nanda, who was appointed as the Returning Officer (RO) for conducting the elections to three vacant posts of the Executive Committee of Archery Association of India.

Capt. Abhimanyu Sandhu presented a bouquet to the Returning Officer as a mark of honour.

While appreciating the efforts made by team AAI under the dynamic leadership and guidance of Shri Arjun Munda, Secretary General stated that our Archers brought many medals and glories to the country. He is hopeful that with the active support of member State Archery Associations/ Associate Members, our Archers would maintain the standard with the same zest and would give more opportunities to us and sports lovers of the country to cheer in coming years too.

Expressing his deep gratitude towards NTPC Ltd for sponsoring National events and apparels to the Indian team, he anticipated a long-lasting alliance between AAI and NTPC which would certainly help India become a strong and vibrant Archery nation.

Hony. Secretary General then requested the Returning Officer to declare the Election results, which was the first agenda item of the General Council meeting.

The RO elucidated that the erstwhile position holders - one Vice-President and two Joint Secretaries of AAI had submitted their resignations in view of one of the requirements of the notification issued by the MYAS for the recognition of AAI. These three positions of the Executive Committee were lying vacant since then.

Since only one nomination was received for each post, the election was held unopposed for all the three vacant posts. One out of three candidates has retired from government service and the remaining two candidates are still employed as government employees. NOCs were submitted by two government employees issued by their respective departments along with the nomination papers. Then, he declared the below placed election results -

The General Council unanimously approved the election of the vacant posts of the Executive Members of Archery Association of India. It was resolved by the General Council that the newly elected members will take respective titles and charge to the office of Archery Association of India with immediate effect till the next election.

Capt. Abhimanyu thanked the Returning Officer for conducting the election of the Archery Association of India smoothly. Subsequently, RO walked away from the meeting hall.



Then, the newly elected Executive Committee Members were welcomed by the President with bouquets.

With the permission of the Chair, the Secretary General took up the agenda items for deliberation and decisions.

**Agenda Item No.1 : Confirmation of Minutes of last General Council Meeting of the AAI held at Dehradun (Uttarakhand) on 7<sup>th</sup> March, 2021.**

The Minutes of the last General Council meeting of AAI held on 7<sup>th</sup> March, 2021 at Dehradun were circulated to the member State Archery Associations/Associate member on which no comment was received by the Association. If the Minutes are approved by the members, the meeting may proceed to consider the next agenda item.

Shri Manoj Kumar, Secretary, Bihar Archery Association and Shri Raghunath Rana, Secretary, H.P. Archery Association proposed that the Minutes be approved by the House. Shri Komjum Riba, representative of Arunachal Pradesh Archery Association seconded the proposal. The Minutes were then adopted and confirmed by the House.

**Agenda Item No.2 : Adoption of Hony.Secretary General's Report.**

Presenting his report before the August House, Hony.Secretary General highlighted the major achievements at International Competitions and Games accomplished during the period under review. Conducting National Championships & National Ranking Tournaments under NTPC, holding Khelo India monthly & Khelo India Women National Ranking Tournaments with the collaboration of SAI and organising Zonal Coaches and Judges' Workshop with the partnership of OGQ were also covered.

He added that during this period, not only the ongoing MOU has been extended for a further period of three years with the Archery Association of India, but we are also in discussion with the NTPC to get the financial assistance of about Rs.115 crores in different developmental projects of Archery Association of India in next five years through MYAS.

The members present in the meeting applauded with open heart and expressed pleasure over the overwhelming support being received from NTPC for the game of Archery.

He was grateful to OGQ for elevating the scale of financial assistance from Rs.60 lakhs to Rs.70 lakhs per annum for conducting Coaches and Judges' Seminars.

He further shared with the members that allocating a sufficient budget of Rs.15 crores for Archery under ACTC, procuring archery equipment worth Rs. 10 crores for the trainees practising in various NCOEs, SAI Centres, Khelo India Academies and setting up a fully equipped Sports Science laboratory at SAI, Sonapat with a total cost of Rs.70 crores are commendable steps taken by the Sports Authority of India.

Shri D.K. Vidhyarthi, representative of Madhya Pradesh Amateur Archery Association pointed out to the Chair about the same participation data of National Championships twice in the Secretary General's report.

In response to above, the Secretary General said that the point has been well noted and the same would be rectified.



Thereafter, a two-minute video clip covering the achievements and activities along with details of various projects/schemes and amounts allocated for them during the year was displayed on a big screen.

Shri S.C.Mohanty, representative of Jharkhand Archery Association expressed his displeasure over the video clip not showing the picture of the 2<sup>nd</sup> National Ranking Archery Tournament held at NIIT, Jamshedpur to which the Secretary General replied that it might have been missed unintentionally but you will find it in the Secretary-General's report.

The motion for the adoption of the Secretary General's Report was proposed by Shri E.Sanjeeva Reddy, Secretary, Telangana Archery Association and Shri Paia B War Nongbri, General Secretary, Archery Association of Meghalaya was seconded by Shri Chetan Kavlekar General Secretary, Amateur Archery Association, Goa and house approved unanimously.

**Item No.4 : Consideration and passing of the Audited Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet of AAI for the Financial Year 2020-21.**

Shri Rajendera Singh Tomar, Hony.Treasurer, Archery Association of India placed the Audited Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet for the financial year 2020-2021.

Due to the pandemic, lockdown and getting recognition from MYAS in the middle of the year, comparatively lesser expenditures were incurred during the financial year 2020-2021 whereas the statement of accounts for the financial year 2021-2022 is still in the process of finalization and would be placed before the House in the next General Council meeting.

Shri Surendra Singh Gurjar, Secretary General of Rajasthan Archery Association proposed that the Audited Statement of Accounts for the year 2020-2021 be approved. It was seconded by Shri V.Lalzawmliana, President, Archery Association of Mizoram.

Audited Statement of Accounts of Archery Association of India for the financial year 2020-2021 was unanimously passed by the House

**Item No.5 : Approval of the Budget for revised estimates for 2021-22 and budget estimates 2022-23.**

The Hony.Treasurer shared with the members that you must be seeing that there has been a huge jump in the budget of the Association as compared to the last year's budget, which is because the Association is buying equipment for our Archers in bulk and secondly, the SAI has transferred an additional responsibility of paying to travel agencies on account of air tickets for the participation of the Indian teams in international competitions.

The House unanimously accorded its approval to pass the revised Budget estimates for the year 2021-22 and Budget estimates for the year 2022-2023 which was placed before the House.

**Item No.6 : Appointment of Auditors for the Financial Year 2021-2022 & 2022-23 and fixation of their remuneration.**

On being put up the next Agenda Item by Hony.Treasurer, Captain Abhimanyu Sandhu, Senior Vice-President proposed that the same auditors' firm, M/s.A.K. Singh & Company at the same



remuneration may be appointed to audit the accounts of Archery Association of India for the sake of continuity due to satisfactory conduct of the audit firm. The proposal was seconded by Shri D.K. Vidhyarthi, representative of Madhya Pradesh Amateur Archery Association and approved by the House.

M/s.A.K. Singh & Company has been appointed Auditors to audit the accounts of AAI for the financial year 2021-2022 & 2022-2023 at the fixed annual remuneration of Rs.80,000 + GST.

### **Item No.7 : Finalization of National Calendar of Events including National Championships & NRATs.**

It was apprised the members by the Secretary General that the scale of financial assistance for Senior, Junior and Sub-Junior National Championships has been revised to Rs.17 Lakhs each keeping uniformity at all levels of National Championships whereas Rs.15 Lakhs would be assisted for Para National by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports.

Uttarakhand Teerandazi Association, Maharashtra Archery Association and Rajasthan Archery Association submitted their bids to host the next years' NTPC National Championships/NTPC National Ranking Archery Tournaments and Zonal Coaches/Judges' Workshops, in writing.

Shri Anil Kamineni, President, Telangana Archery Association was of the view that those State Associations/Associate Members which have never conducted any National Championship or had conducted a national event several years ago should come forward to host the next years' NTPC National Championships/NRATs. Preference should also be given to North-East States.

Ms.Matsiedor War Nongbri, President, Archery Association of Meghalaya proposed to host the 4<sup>th</sup> NTPC National Ranking Archery Tournament of current year at Shillong.

Shri D.K. Vidhyarthi of Madhya Pradesh Amateur Archery Association showed his willingness to host the maiden NTPC National Ranking Archery Tournaments of next session in Madhya Pradesh.

With the consent of the representative of Kerala Archery Association, the House decided to shift the 4<sup>th</sup> National Ranking Archery Tournament to Shillong which was allotted to be staged at Kochi.

Dr.Joris Paulose Ummacheril, representative of Kerala Archery Association, Shri Rupesh Kar, General Secretary of West Bengal Archers' Association, Dr.K.B.Gurung, General Secretary of Sikkim Archery Association were interested to hold NTPC National Ranking Archery Tournaments of the subsequent year.

Shri Chetan Kavlekar, Secretary of Amateur Archery Association of Goa and Shri Kailash Murarka President of Chhattisgarh Archery Associations reiterated their willingness to conduct Junior and Sub-Junior National Archery Championships at Goa and Raipur respectively.

Members welcomed the bid of hosting the Senior National Championship by Gujarat Archery Association for the first time.

It was the consensus view of the house to host the NTPC Final National Ranking Archery Tournament at the capital city - Delhi in view of the importance of the event.

All the bids were accepted by the House with the condition that the prospective member host states will have to communicate back to the AAI with the fixed venues and convenient dates for hosting the National Championships and National Ranking Archery Tournaments within 15 days from the date of the GC meeting, so that the calendar of events could be finalized by the AAI.



The events for which no State Association has come forward, will be decided with the concurrence of the President, AAI.

Based on the interest shown by the member State Associations, the House agreed to allot the Zonal Coaches and Judges' Workshops as per details given below :-

Shri Sanjeev Kumar Singh, General Council Member, being an outstanding archer, suggested that keeping in view the low budget allocated by the SAI for holding the Women's National Ranking Archery Tournament, it should be conducted immediately after the National Ranking Archery Tournament utilizing the ground and ground facilities, equipment etc.

Shri Rupesh Kar expressed his total disagreement on this point. He believed that having one tournament after another would put too much pressure on the Archers which is not good for them at all.

Since the House was divided on this point, the Chairman took a decision to leave the matter up to the discretion of the host Associations to consider conducting Women National Ranking Archery Tournament with NTPC NRAT as per their own wish and comfortability. There will be no pressure from the AAI on the host.

Shri Satyanarayana Cherukuri, Secretary, Andhra Pradesh Archery Association raised his proposal of organizing U14 National Ranking Archery Tournament under the banner of NTPC. He further said that if NTPC does not sponsor this event, then he will take the responsibility of conducting it himself like he has been organizing Mini National in Andhra Pradesh continuously for many years without any support except for the last one.


While showing full support to the idea of Shri Satyanarayana, Shri Syed Ali Hussaini requested the AAI to incorporate the U14 National Ranking Archery Tournament in the MOU to be signed with NTPC to sponsor various projects.

The Secretary General replied that it seems difficult at this point of time as the project for which the money is to be given is almost finalized and it will not be possible to promise anything as of now.

Shri Anil Kamineni stood up to say to the House that NTPC intends to spend 115 crores to promote grassroots Archery and the U-14 event is itself a grassroots level event only. Hence, we should request NTPC to include the NRAT of the U-14 event in the project which was welcomed with applause by the members.

The Secretary General asked the House whether the Under 9 event should be conducted or not as the issue was raised in the EC meeting yesterday.

Shri Satyanaryana Cherukuri clarified that the events of Under 14 & Under 9 were properly passed in the General Council Meeting while the proposal for Under 5 was also put up which was not approved by the House. He also put up a fresh proposal to hold U12 event with U14 and U9 events before the House for approval.



Mr. Sanjeev Kumar Singh appreciated the proposal and showed his support to the proposal to organize events for U14, U12 and U9 so that our archers can be prepared for future Olympic Games from now.

Shri Syed Ali Hussaini advocated for organizing the suggested Archery events for all the three age groups to further promote the sport of Archery.

Shri Rupesh Kar clarified that he did not mean to stop the already happening events, rather I wanted to say that the U14 and U9 events are not organized by World Archery and AAI didn't have competition rules in this regard. There is no problem if AAI wants to include the Under 12 event as well, provided there should have clear-cut rules for the conduct. He was of the view that Under 12 and Under 9 should be declared Open Events.

Finally, the House approved events for the Under 14, Under 12 and Under 9 age groups, placing the Under 12 and Under 9 events in the open category. The House realized the need to formulate competition rules for different age groups and the task of framing the competition rules was given by the Secretary General to the Committee of Judges.

Shri Lobzang Sherab, representative of Ladakh Archery Association thanked the Archery Association of India for supporting Ladakh Archery which will certainly go a long way toward the promotion and development of Archery in this region under the leadership of our President, Shri Jamyang Tsering Namgyal. He asked for a competent High-Performance Coach to train the trainees of Ladakh.

Secretary General requested HPD to help in finding a suitable coach for the position in Ladakh.

Chairman welcomed Shri Upendra Mishra, Deputy General Manager (CSR), NTPC Ltd with bouquet on his arrival of the meeting.

The Secretary General appreciated the NTPC Management for giving special attention to the ancient sport of Archery, which will prove to be a milestone in taking this sport to the heights of skies. He also thanked Shri Upendra Mishra ji for his personal interest and cooperation, who was instrumental in executing the ongoing MOU with NTPC and moving forward the fresh MOU.

#### **Item No.8 : Preparation of teams for Asian Games, World Cups, World Games etc.**

The Secretary General informed the members that almost all the international competitions of the current calendar year are over except one. Our Senior 'B' team is working very hard to win maximum number of medals in World Cup Stage 4. The Asian Games, originally scheduled from 10<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> September 2022, were postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. After the announcement of the new dates, the selection process will be announced again.

#### **Item No.9 : Finalization of hosting International Competitions in India in 2022-2023.**

The Secretary General told the House that there are plans to organize Invitational International Archery Competitions in Jharkhand and Madhya Pradesh. Soon after this meeting, AAI will hold a meeting with the representatives of Tata Archery Academy to discuss various issues for the event in Jamshedpur.



**Item No.10 : Consider Affiliation / Disaffiliation of State Associations / Units, as recommended by the Executive Committee.**

Taking up the agenda, the Secretary General raised the issue related to the affiliation of the Punjab Archery Association, due to which many talented Archers of Punjab are forced to participate under the banner of Archery Association of India, thereby facing many problems.

He apprised the General Council about the decision taken by the Executive Committee that the Punjab Archery Association should follow its own constitution to move ahead under intimation to the AAI.

The General Council ratified the decision of the Executive Committee on Punjab Archery Association and the AAI Secretariat has been directed to apprise the Punjab Archery Association about the GC decision.

The grant of affiliation to Archery Association of Andaman & Nicobar was discussed in the meeting among the members. It was shared with the members that the Andaman and Nicobar Archery Association has been a member of the Archery Association of India for some years. The affiliation of the said Association was terminated by the General Council in 2016 due to irregular participation in National Championships. Now, Archery Association of Andaman and Nicobar has written to AAI seeking re-affiliation with AAI by clearing all its dues of affiliation fee of previous years. He sought the comments of the House to take a call on the affiliation of this body.

Shri Syed Ali Hussaini extended his support for the Archery Association of Andaman & Nicobar to be affiliated with the Archery Association of India after making payment of requisite fee.

The Secretary General and Treasurer invited the attention of the House towards the guidelines of Ministry/SAI which says the admissible financial assistance is deducted proportionately, if the 3/4<sup>th</sup> units of affiliated members do not participate in the National Championship, as a result of which the host Associations have to suffer a financial loss. Hence, we should be very careful while considering the application for a new affiliation. The new affiliation should be granted only to those State Associations/Associate Members that accept the AAI's condition to regularly send their teams to national championships.

There was a demand from Dr.Joris Paulose to identify and disaffiliate such State Archery Associations/Units which are inconsistent in sending their teams in National Championships.

Shri Anil Kamineni read out the relevant clauses of the AAI Constitution which clearly defines that "The membership of a State Archery Associations/Board which does not participate in two consecutive National Championships at either Senior/Junior/Sub-Junior/Under-14 levels shall automatically stand suspended. A simple majority of members of the General Council present and voting in a meeting may renew the membership of such Association/Board" Therefore, he stressed on acting as per the provisions envisaged in the AAI constitution and also added that AAI should encourage more and more associations to come and participate in the national championships.

Showing complete concurrence with Shri Anil Kamineni and Dr.Joris Paulose, Shri Virendra Sachdeva expressed his views that if any affiliated unit of the AAI does not participate in the National Championships continuously, then the Association should remove such units following its constitution.

In this way, the General Council agreed to grant affiliation to the Association of Andaman and Nicobar.



**Item No.11. : Any other subject with the permission of the Chair.**

The Secretary General then sought permission from the Chairman to raise a few matters on which the discussion was held in the Executive Committee meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 and are not covered in the listed Agenda Items.

He then informed the House that in the Executive Committee meeting, it was considered to give TA/DA to the members of the Executive Committee. Hon'ble President stressed on the need to study the income and expenditure of the Association to take a decision on the subject for which Shri Anil Kamineni was asked to submit a report along with his recommendations.

Shri Anil Kamineni was also entrusted with the responsibility of looking into the issue of the Judges' Workshop in Dehradun by the President which has been raised in the last several meetings. Based on his report/recommendation, a final call on issuing the certificates to the eligible candidates would be taken.

Recalling the decisions taken in the last meeting of the Executive Committee held in Dehradun, the Secretary General said that a committee was to be constituted for deciding the line of actions after the suspension of the General Secretary and Treasurer of the Chandigarh Archery Association, which is still pending. Shri Rajendra Singh Tomar briefed the House about the matter and suggested to constitute a committee in this meeting. Subsequently, Senior Vice-President announce a committee under the Chairmanship of Mr. Sunil Sharma and two members - Mr. Ramnivas Hooda and Shri R.K. Bali which to look into the issue and submit its report to AAI at the earliest.

It was felt by the Executive Committee that the annual membership fees of the State Archery Associations and Associate Members have not been increased for the last several years. Executive Committee Members were consensus to increase the Annual Membership Fee of the State Archery Associations from Rs 1,000/- to Rs 2,500/- and to elevate the Annual Membership Fee of Associate Members from Rs 2000/- to Rs 5,000/-.

By putting a proposal to increase the Annual Membership Fees of State Associations and Associate Members before the General Council, the Secretary-General sought the opinion of the members on the matter.

There was a demand from Shri Amrinder Singh Bazaz that the Member State Associations should also get some financial assistance annually from the AAI like the Association gets every year from the Indian Olympic Association, to which the Hon'ble Treasurer replied that when the new body took over the charge, the financial condition of the Association was very bad. The account of the association was almost empty but now the financial position is slowly recovering under the leadership of new body. We shall definitely consider the issue of giving financial assistants to state associations in future.

The House was in agreement with the Executive Committee to elevate the Annual Membership Fee of State Archery Associations from Rs.1,000/- to Rs.2,500/- and in the case of Associate Members to increase from Rs.2,000/- to Rs.5,000/-.

The Chairman instructed the AAI to execute the enhancement in fee with effect from the Financial Year 2022-2023. He further directed to amend the AAI Constitution accordingly.

The Secretary General asked the House for permission to recruit additional staff in the Association as the work of the Association has increased manifold and the Association badly needs about 10-12 employees to meet the office works efficiently. He assured the General Council that there would

be no additional burden of increased staff on the Association as the salary of such employees would come from either SAI or NTPC or any other source.

He further sought permission from the House to pay 80,000/- + GST per month as rent to the Delhi Development Authority where the AAI is going to shift its office. Since the office space was allotted to the Delhi Archery Association, an agreement was required to be signed with the Delhi Archery Association to utilize the space for running the AAI Secretariat.

The House approved both the above proposals unanimously.

In order to strengthen the financial position of the Association, the Secretary General suggested that the Association should charge a fixed fee of Rs.25,000/- per event from those identities who are willing to host the Invitational Archery event at their District/Centre/Academy etc. and asking for the technical and administrative support from the AAI.

Shri Virendra Sachdeva, General Secretary, Delhi Archery Association, Shri Syed Ali Hussaini, Shri Joris Paulose Ummacheril vehemently opposed the proposal.

Shri Sudhir Kumar Hooda, representative of RSPB supported the proposal giving reference to similar rules in other National Sports Federation whereas some members were felt that the amount being charged was on the higher side.

The Chairman suggested that the Archery Association of India would charge a nominal fee of Rs. 10,000/- from the host identity against providing administrative and technical support to conduct an Invitation Archery event. In return, the Association would give recognition to such events with no financial and other obligations to the AAI. In this context, detailed guidelines/norms will be framed by the Association.

Then, Secretary General brought up a point with regard to amount given to Delhi Archery Association by Archery Association of India giving brief background. There is confusion going on that whether this amount should be considered as loan or grant. Since this subject has been going on for a long time and was raised in the last EC meeting, it has to be sorted out now. An important point in this is that no bills, vouchers, receipts, utilization certificate etc. related to this championship are available in the records of the Association.

Shri Syed Ali Hussaini was the first to come forward to say his point that this matter should end today itself forever.

Shri Kailash Murarka was of the opinion that this matter should be referred to the President and it should be left to his discretion.

The Chairman spoke about the proposal put up to rectify the accounting error on the Table of this House by the Secretary General. Delhi Archery Association is showing the amount of Rs.27,45,096/- as a grant in its account, but on the contrary, AAI has been reflecting this amount as a loan in its accounts, hence there is some accounting confusion on this subject. However, there was never any confusion about the championship, situation and the costs involved. Due to not being able to get that year's championship organized by one of the member associations, this responsibility was passed on to the Delhi Archery Association and support was extended by the AAI to meet the expenditures of the event. The members' voices on this subject are very clear that it's been a long time and can't be stretched more.

The Chairman made clear that the Annual General Council has sufficient power to take a call on the matter and close it once and for all today itself, instead of going to the second option of



referring it to the President. Now it is up to the AGM to decide whether this amount is to be converted from loan to grant in the accounts of the Archery Association of India.

All the members present in the meeting registered their approval in unison with thunderous applause.

On being asked by the Secretary-General whether this matter has to be confirmed with or without documents, the Chairman mentioned that in the observation of the committee formed on it, it came to the fore that all the documents related to the Championship, Utilization Certificate, bills and supporting vouchers were submitted to the office of AAI and the Association has never been intimated about any deficiency of documents. In this case, the responsibility of documents falls on AAI. We also know that in the last few years there was a vacuum situation in the Association due to which those documents could not be kept properly.

Secondly, it is clear that the audited statement of accounts was submitted by the Delhi Archery Association. Anyone who understands accounts and audits knows that no auditor will audit the accounts of the Association without supporting bills and vouchers, in original. This means that bills and vouchers must have been there at the time the audit took place. It is also clear now that the documents are not available today, then in this case the audited Statement of Accounts can be treated as documentary evidence.

On being inquired by Secretary General about receipt against submission of documents from the AAI office, Shri Virendra Sachdeva replied that the accounts of Delhi Archery Association for the financial year 2014-2015 were maintained by the Accounts Officer of AAI in the office of the Association itself. We all know that between 2017 and 2019 the activities of the Association were run first by the Administrator, then by the Transitory Committee and later by the body headed by Shri BVP Rao. The Assistant Secretary was called to the SAI Headquarters and there was no responsible officer to handle the office of the Association. We tried our best to search the documents at the offices of Archery Association of India, Delhi Archery Association, Chartered Accountant firm and other places but could not locate them. The computers of that time had also crashed, due to which we were unable to get the supporting bills & vouchers.


The Chairman noted the points well mentioned by Shri Virendra Sachdeva and concluded that it cannot be denied that the money was given by AAI to DAA and that money was received by DAA and was shown clearly by the DAA in their accounts. It was also found to be a fact that the money given was utilized for the same purpose for which it was released. AAI have also an option to write off this amount, but according to accounting principles it is advisable if we decide to convert the amount shown as loan in the accounts of the association into grant which also for a bonafide reason. In many cases, it is commonly seen that the State Governments and the central government convert the amounts given under the loans many years ago into grants. There is nothing unusual in this.

The House was agreed, in principle, to convert the amount of Rs.27,45,096/- shown as loan to Delhi Archery Association in the accounts of AAI into grant with the concurrence of Hon'ble President. The Secretary General registered his strong opposition to the resolution.

The members present in the meeting and the Secretary General thanked the Chair for resolving the matter.

Thereafter, the Secretary General requested Shri Das Gupta, Managing Director of M/s. Leisure Sports Management Ltd to present the PPT prepared for conducting the Indian Archery League.

Before the presentation of PPT, Shri Anil Kamineni sought permission from the Chair to brief about Archery League. He said that the concept of the Archery League was first placed in the World

Archery Congress in 2014 but after that, we could not take it forward due to many developments in Indian Archery. The main purpose of pursuing the Archery League is to train our Archers for handling the pressure at the highest level, especially in the Olympic Games. Our objective is to bring the Olympic medal for the country by the able Archers as one of the Indian Para Archers did recently in Tokyo Paralympics. The proposal was discussed in detail with various leading companies in the sector like Baseline Ventures India Pvt Ltd, Sportz, Live Entertainment Pvt Ltd, Leisure Sports Management Ltd and Findus Sports Management Pvt Ltd and Leisure Sports Management Ltd. was the final choice of the committee headed by Shri Virendra Sachdeva. Top Indian and foreign archers will be involved in this league. Inputs have also been received from World Archery and other experts.


Shri Das Gupta of Leisure Sports Management Ltd. then highlighted the various features, basic competition format, Archery field, financial terms etc. of the Archery League for the information of members, which was highly appreciated by the members. The proposal to organize the Archery League was accepted by all the members present in the meeting and gave their support to go ahead with it.

The Secretary General referred to a meeting held with the Joint Secretary (Sports) in which the Archery Association of India and some other National Sports Federations were asked to make some amendments in their Constitution so as to match with the Sports Code. For this, he asked the Assistant Secretary to meet the concerned officer in the MYAS to find out what amendments needed to be made in the constitution of the Association so that further action could be taken on it accordingly.

The Secretary-General praised those international judges who are working at international events for the World Archery but at the same time, we have to discuss in this meeting whether such judges would not work at the National, State and District levels.

At the end of the meeting, Shri Sanjeev Kumar Singh has presented a very comprehensive and detailed outline of the project to be spent by NTPC in the form of a detailed project report in the form of a detailed project report of Rs. This included the necessary information such as resources, budget and tasks to be completed.

The meeting came to an end with a vote of thanks to all the participants.










